- If Adelaide's 1954 earthquake occurred today it would cause at least \$1B in damage.
- In 1954 it hit the front pages of newspapers in the Unites States.
- The recent earthquake in Southern Sumatra on 16 February was a similar size.
- A bigger quake in Adelaide is possible and could have disastrous results.

Three of South Australia's foremost earthquake experts will speak at a free public lecture on earthquakes and what we can do to minimise their damage.

The lectures will look at the past, present and future of earthquakes and describe the earthquake research in South Australia:

- What the 1954 earthquake was like.
- How much damage it caused.
- What research is being done now to minimise the risk of earthquake damage.
- How prepared we are to respond if a similar quake were to occur again.
- What every individual needs to do to improve safety and reduce the damage in their own environment.
